
Kristin Kohlis

Ten Thousand Villages Houston: Thanks for the Memories!





District 10 STEM Scholarship Applications Being Accepted Through February 1, 2017



Applications for the District 10 \$1000 scholarship for women majoring in science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM) fields are now being accepted. The scholarship will be awarded to a US citizen or permanent resident who has

completed 30 college hours in a STEM field and who resides in one of the following District 10 states: Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma or Texas.

Application materials and more information on eligibility requirements are on the District 10 website www.zontadistrict10.org. The application deadline is February 1, 2016. The scholarship will be awarded for the fall of 2017. The District STEM committee is currently distributing information and applications to colleges and universities in the five state area of the district. District 10 members are encouraged to distribute applications to eligible students of their acquaintance. Questions may be directed to STEM Committee Chair, Jennifer Ehlers.


